



#### Sexual Harassment in the Rural Workplace

TWiA (Tasmanian Women in Agriculture) are running a survey to contribute to the National Enquiry into Sexual Harassment in the Workplace which finalizes its enquiry on 31 January 2019. TWiA believes there is a huge culture of silence around sexual harassment in rural workplaces. We want to understand how prevalent sexual harassment is in the rural workplace and whether employers do address harassment with policies, training and acting on complaints. The survey is anonymous and will help TWiA contribute to the *National Inquiry into Sexual Harassment in the Workplace* and ultimately to provide support to our stakeholders in reducing workplace sexual harassment. The survey should take approximately 5 minutes to complete.

The end of 2018 has been positive and busy for Tamar Club.




