

Hey everyone,


Hope you all had a great Christmas and New Year.

We have had a very busy month in January with updating the systems for the generating of letters for Agfest site allocations. All exhibitors were notified by post on the 31st January and as February starts we will be collecting payments and fielding phone calls from unsuccessful applicants. Selena will be on personal leave from the 18th February to the 24th February and then working off site for the remainder of February and early March.

Reminder:

We still have several Rural Youth Club AGM forms outstanding please return to the Office ASAP.

Finance – The financial year ending December 2013 has now been closed off, we've had the auditor in the office for a couple of days doing their thing, and Linda is now in the process of finalising all the required paperwork so the audit and financial report can be prepared in readiness for the annual report. The final combined budget was approved at RAC on 11th January and the cash flow budget for each entity has now been entered into MYOB ready for the end of January reports. Updating of existing exhibitors and entering new exhibitors onto MYOB takes a lot of time but this is a necessary step before invoicing commences after the Australia Day weekend - over 600 invoices in 2 days.
