Agfest Positions Vacant

Are you keen to get involved with the biggest event in Tassie?

Yes I hear you say, well there are some roles vacant with in the Agfest Committee for Agfest 2015. The following are coordinator positions and have a small explanation of what is involved, a few years' experience volunteering at Agfest is a big advantage for coordinator role but not essential.

The second list below are assistant positions where your main role is to shadow the coordinator in the role to see how it works, then next year your will know what it is all about to step up in to the coordinators role.

To apply for any of the positions you would need to be available from approximately the 3rd May 2015 till the 10th/11th May 2015, and also be able to attend committee meetings held every 4-6 weeks, if not be able to submit a report (coordinator positions). If this can work for you please send an email to Amanda by 10th December, on chairman@agfest.com.au with which positions you would be interested in taking on and that you will be able to work with the times list above. A member of exec will contact you shortly after the 12th December.

Coordinator roles

Car Park – exhibitors – work with the other car park coordinators to set each other's car parks and on the days of Agfest you will be in charge of a group of volunteers to park the exhibitors' cars.

Catering – This person looks after the community caterers on site, liaises with our function centre caterer to cook our meals and purchases snacks & drinks for volunteers. On some days you will be taxi'ing food around site when it's too busy for people to get back to personnel.

Parcel Pick up – Your will be in charge of the parcel pick up crew of 3 other gators collecting goods on request from exhibitors sites to take for collection at the top of each car park in the containers

Ticket box – this role is based at the back ticket box, you will be the leader of 4 volunteers to sell tickets coming through the east entrance. You will have a community group there to collect the pre-paid tickets. You will work closely with the treasurer and asst treasurer.

Trades Expo & asst exhibitor manager – In this role you will organise exhibitors to go in the trades expo tent (24 max), you organise the tent going up and supervise that the stalls are in the correct place and hang the signs for the appropriate sites. You are also the assistant to the exhibitor manager with over 600 exhibitors, being a shadow learning what the role entails. There is also site marking in the weeks prior Agfest to ensure that exhibitors set up in the right area.

Property Management Positions Open to all Rural Youth Members

The new property management committee was elected in August and now as the committee has meet to get started for the coming 12 months the following positions are now available.

All positions report to the Property Management Chairman Keith Lee. They don't require a person to be an expert in the field just someone that has a general understanding of the topic and can give a report to Keith and the committee. If there are repairs that are required they may be asked to organise quotes to repair.

In any position that you take on you're not alone, Keith as Chairman is there to help guide and also the office can give guidance to help on some issues. The committee just needs you to attend working bees and meetings to keep a handle of what is happening at Quercus. Below is a list of the positions available and a few notes of what you would be expected to complete.

Vegetation management: Checking trees, shrubs, weeds, greening Australia area.

Roads and drains: Checking roads for holes, uneven surfaces, drains for blockages and they are flowing.

Pumps and water: General maintenance checking of water, oil, fuel levels, servicing schedules and tanks are at required levels.

Project management: From time to time the site is hired out to large site hires, you would be the first point of contact and have a good knowledge of the site.

Fences and gates: Checking fences, gates are all in good order and have jobs added to the working bee jobs if members can fix or organise quotes for a contractor to repair.

Building maintenance: Checking aspect including and not limited to cleanliness, gutters, repairs that may need quotes.

Communication: Create any ads like this one for the newsletter, be able to take the minutes at committee meetings.

Serrated Tussock in Tasmania

Serrated Tussock (Nassella trichotoma)

Serrated Tussock is a name that strikes fear into the hearts of farmers and land managers who know it. It is one of the worst agricultural weeds of temperate Australia.

Serrated tussock is of no nutritional value to livestock. Its high fibre and low protein content mean that livestock forced to graze Serrated Tussock can starve to death with a full stomach. A Serrated Tussock infestation left unchecked has the potential to reduce pasture productivity by up to 95% with the cost of controlling a serious infestation often more than the value of the land itself.

A perennial grass to 600mm, to the unfamiliar eye it is almost indistinguishable from Native Tussocks. The plant rapidly colonises any bare ground it finds and is of particular concern on non-arable, pastoral land with poor soil fertility, low rainfall (or in drought) and where over grazing has led to poor ground cover.

It is estimated that Serrated Tussock now covers over a million hectares in NSW, Vic, ACT and Tasmania. The cost of control and lost production to agriculture across Australia is estimated somewhere in the order of \$45M annually.

Serrated Tussock in Tasmania.

In Tasmania the main Serrated Tussock infestations are in the Clarence and Sorell Municipalities in the south, however there are isolated sites on the East Coast, King Island, Northern Midlands and a single known infestation at Mt Direction in the Tamar region.

Serrated Tussock is a prolific seed bearer. In areas with establish infestations like Clarence and Sorrell, wind is by far the greatest vector for spread. The seed head breaks off the plant as a whole and blow in the wind like little tumbleweeds. Most of the seed will drop within 500m of the parent plant but on occasion the seed heads can pick up in an up draft and have been recorded travelling up to 20km.

For the rest of Tasmania the main vectors for incursion are contaminated vehicles and machinery, contaminated stock feed and the movement of livestock. With livestock the seed remains viable after passing through the gut, which can take up to 10 days. The large Serrated Tussock infestation near Cressy was thought to have been introduced to the site in this way.

For me working as a Facilitator in the Tamar the challenge is making farmers care about a threat that they have never seen or experienced before, battling against that 'out of sight - out of mind' mentality. We know that Serrated Tussock is here in the state and that it is only a matter of time before we find another infestation somewhere. The consequences of it getting away from us are too great to ignore and that's why Tamar NRM have become advocates of 'Farm Biosecurity'.

A Biosecurity Approach

Farm Biosecurity is a set of measures designed to minimise the risk of weeds, pests and disease entering a property. Many aspects of Farm Biosecurity are simple management changes that cost little to no time and money to implement. There is now compelling evidence within the agricultural sciences that simple measures to prevent pest and disease incursion is a much cheaper option compared to dealing with a problem after it has arrived. Examples of Biosecurity measures could include: setting up a quarantine paddock, inspecting a sellers hay paddocks and feed before you buy it and ensuring contractors vehicles and machinery are cleaned before they arrive on site.

I recommend you all have a look into Farm Biosecurity, it might just stop your property becoming the next Serrated Tussock Case Study


