Executive Officer Report

The Marquees are now starting to fill the Quercus Park site and, as the new kid on the block, it is exciting to be involved in one of Tassie's largest events. This year we have a record number of exhibitors - 760 (see charts below). I have now stopped trying to work on other projects and accepted the inevitable - April is ONLY about Agfest and non urgent tasks must be sent to the "after Agfest " list. A large event, which takes a lot of work from our tireless members, needs a complete focus on the end game - a safe, successful Agfest, with some sun. None of us are naive enough to think there will not be some problems along the way but with a dedicated team working together we hope the problems will be small and easily ratified.

The staff have warned me that the Agfest food variety/ quality is exceptional and that eating too much and drinking too much coffee may be a problem. The function center catering this year will be provided by Devonfield Enterprises Incorporated from Devonport. Devonfield, an Australian Disability Employer, are experienced caterers who provide this service to promote independence and acceptance of people with disabilities.

Official Agfest Charity

I would like to commend the 2014 Committee for their decision to support a charity by offering a free site at Agfest to enable them to promote their service to a concentrated audience. Expressions of interest were advertised and "Life Without Barriers" was selected from twelve outstanding applications.

"Life Without Barriers" started as a small service which now has over 100 offices in Australia and New Zealand, where people with disability are assisted to build their lives and confidence. Life Without Barriers operates from offices in Launceston, Hobart and Burnie but draws on a wealth of experience across the country to ensure communities - from city suburbs to remote communities - all receive the best quality of care, solving problems and working with people to tackle even the most difficult and challenging situations. In Tasmania, they offer foster and residential care, disability services, mental health, education and refugee/asylum seeker support. Please show your support for the Official Agfest Charity "Life Without Barriers" at Site M09 on the corner of First Avenue & Main Street.

Administration is busy, busy, busy and only urgent non Agfest requests will be actioned prior to Agfest. Selena and Kadesha will be moving the office out to the Quercus Rural Youth Park site office on Monday 28th April and the office telephone will be diverted to the site office on that day, Linda will be there on the Tuesday and Judy on the Wednesday. With an extra staff member this year we will have the opportunity to rotate the staff around some of the Agfest positions. Our new receptionist Kadesha, as an Agfest induction, will be trailing some of the executive staff each morning and Linda will be assisting the Agfest Treasurer, Tracey, each morning.

Finance - the number of invoices and statements flowing in to the office is increasing daily, a timely reminder that orders need to be used, and forwarded to the office as soon as possible after the purchase, along with the invoice if received at the time of purchase.

We have ordered sunshine for the Agfest week and for those attending - Members, Past Members, VIP's, Community Volunteers, Exhibitors or Patrons - I hope you enjoy your time at Agfest 2014.
