Agfest Field Days 2016. (As of Sunday 22/11)

Our Committee met on Friday 20th November for our final meeting prior to 2016! Following this meeting we held a budget setting discussion Saturday morning, this was a beneficial experience for many, gaining an understanding of the full events budget and the importance of communication and working together. We are certainly a huge step closer to having budgets finalised and confirmed prior to the beginning of 2016.

Sadly we have had two members of our committee resign from their committee position of the Safety and Power Directorships, a tough decision to make, but I would like to acknowledge both Derryn Badcock and Jake Williams for their contributions this year, and years leading up to this. As mentioned during meeting, it is great to see the quantity of interest in these positions of mentorship, and the drive within our committee base.

A special thanks to Brett Mackenzie, David Smink, Allan Crosswell and Anthony Coad for supplying their time and expertise in testing the drainage and identifying areas we need to have some development works carried out on within the Equine Arena.



The Committee have made the decision for 2016 to trial a move of the Personnel Office during the Field Days to the small meeting room of the Function Centre. The main reason for this move is the WHS improvement to being on the static site, having volunteers report to Personnel prior to commencing work, and on completion of the day for the evening meal. Within this area, I will also have an admin space (laptop/phone charger) set up for when I am not roaming site communicating to those enabling our success and whatever else the 2016 event holds for us!

We slightly increased our approach this year in marketing of our application period timeframe. Starting with the standard release of EDM (electronic/email direct marketing) to all contacts. Followed by release of media release. Last month I mentioned the "Why Agfest" flyer campaign, and excited to share that beginning Monday 23rd November right through to December 1st we will be promoting on Southern Cross, 7Mate and 7Two with our "Why Agfest? Television campaign and paid Facebook boosting. Along with the Exhibitor applications closing near, it is also closing date for the Agfest Charity of Choice application period, and the Community Group expression of interest period.

The opportunity behind Agfest Official Charity of Choice, a development of the 2014 Agfest Committee, offers avenue for all charities and non-for-profits to apply for the one chance to have a presence at Agfest Field Days in receiving a donated site, brand alignment as Agfest Official Charity of Choice, and receiving a monetary donation from all ATM transaction fees charged during the event. In 2014 this was awarded to Life Without Barriers, and 2015 The Royal Flying Doctors Association, it is exciting to see applications submitted and consideration in who our event can support in 2016! Announcement will be made with the Successful Exhibitor Application period in January/ February 2016.

Each year our event provides opportunity for many non-for-profit community groups to get involved with our event, raising profiles of these groups and boosting funding in a fee for service relationship! The Agfest Committee reserves \$15,000 towards these valuable opportunities of Agfest Community Group service, with 13 opportunities available! 
