
I can't wait to be home to start the next chapter of my life with a very big move. This is the first public disclosure of it but I am on the move and moving down south for my work which I am so very excited about.

Agfest Report

Hi all.

Well Agfest has come and gone for another year. Unfortunately it fell in the middle week when we had some pretty bad wind in the state, but sticking to our ways Agfest opened on the first Thursday in May at 8am. Thursday saw 14,420 people come through the gates a little down on last year but was great to talk to exhibitors who were really pleased with sales.

Friday, another slightly windy day with the weather saw 18,461 people come through the gates and it could definitely be seen that the streets were fuller than the day before, exhibitors again happy with sales. Our big day Saturday saw us turn to the over flow car park and have 23,860 people come through the gates to see Agfest bringing the total number for the three days to 56,741 people through the gates for the three days.

This year saw a first in that we closed the site early on the Tuesday due to the massive amount of wind and rain coming through the site. An evacuation that we had never done before or even a drill, thanks to all the exhibitors and volunteers for their cooperation in securing and evacuating the site.

A massive thanks to all volunteers that helped out at Agfest and made it happen from the bunch of us out at Quercus each weekend prior, to those who juggled days off from work to be at Agfest for part days, and then importantly the actual days – it is all very much appreciated – you help make Agfest what it is, so THANK YOU once again, a big pat on the back to you all

348 days till Agfest 2016, which sounds scary but planning will soon commence and if you would like to be involved please fill in the self-nomination form in the newsletter and return by AGM time (3rd of July). You will notice that the form has slightly changed this year as the needs of the Agfest committee have also. This will be presented further at the upcoming Agfest meetings.

Coming up is an Agfest meeting on the 5th June at Head Office and the Agfest dinner on the 6th of June at Quercus. The meal for the evening is FREE for all that volunteered at Agfest so come along and have a great night.

Hagley Rural Youth members Mitch Beer and Will Craigie volunteered their time at Agfest and were also patrons.


Our next meeting is on Thursday 28th May at the Westbury Pub commencing at 7pm.



Westmorland has been relatively quiet over the last couple of months leading into Agfest.


With Prue heading off on exchange we had a tea meeting at 'the shout' bar in Launceston and had a good general catch up.


