


Agfest excitedly launched our new website on the 1st of October along with the application form for 2015 which is now a web based form. Within the first week there were 50 applications completed and over half had clicked on the link to look at the form, now three weeks down the track there are 462 applications completed or in progress. Broken down as follows:


