RURAL YOUTH STATE PRESIDENT

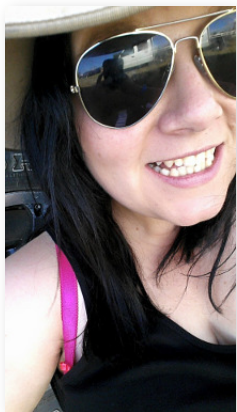

What to expect from 2016;


Official Opening: Thursday 5th May located in Central Arena at 11:15am followed by the Networking Event and formal Official Opening from 5:30pm until 7:00pm in the Rural Youth Function Centre. With over 70 attendees so far – this is set to be a prime networking opportunity for the many faces of Agfest 2016.

Committee updates: there have been a few changes within the committee with the resignation of Anthony Coad from Assistant Personnel & Accommodation, the appointment of our second Assistant Equine, Korey Stratton, and welcome to Dave Lucas of Sorell Club – also Southern Region Rural Youth President as our Assistant Power Director. 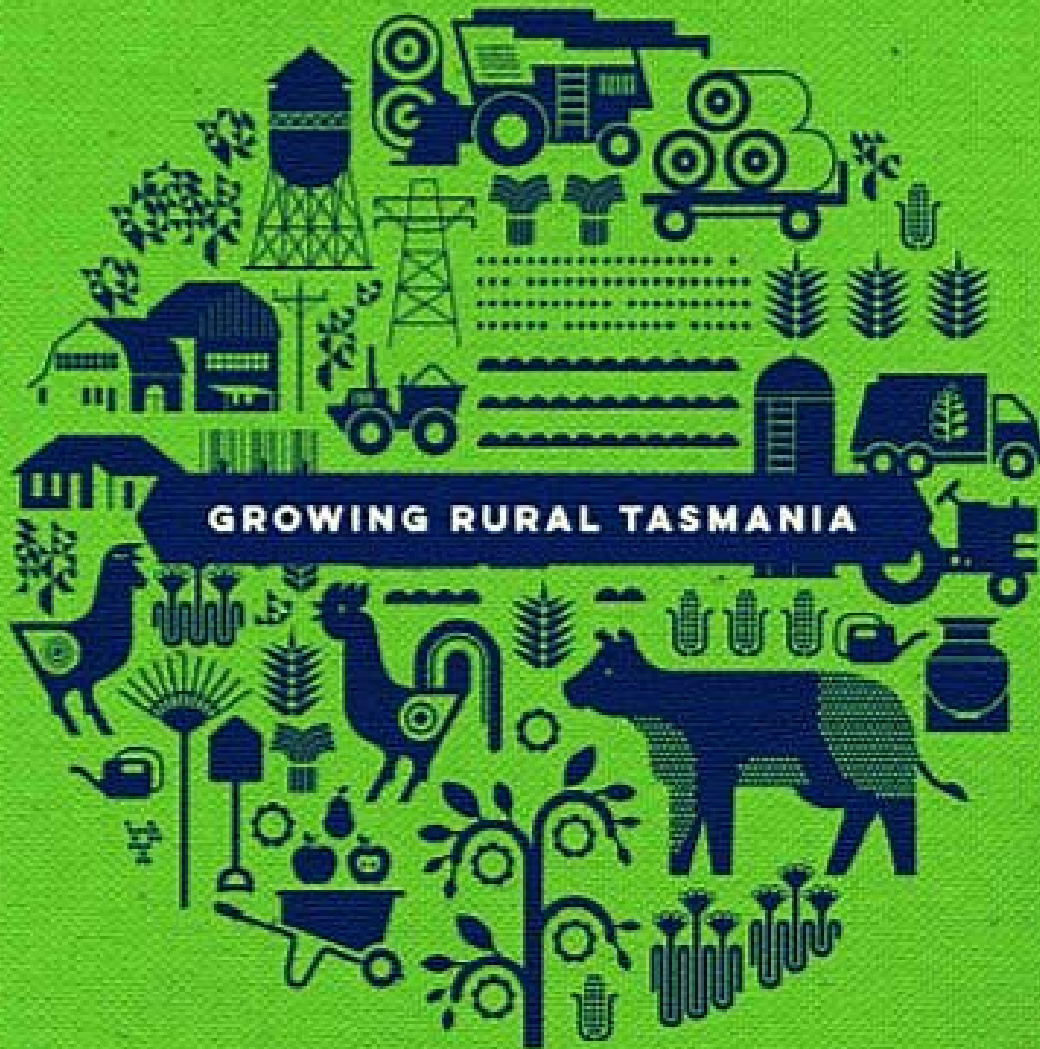

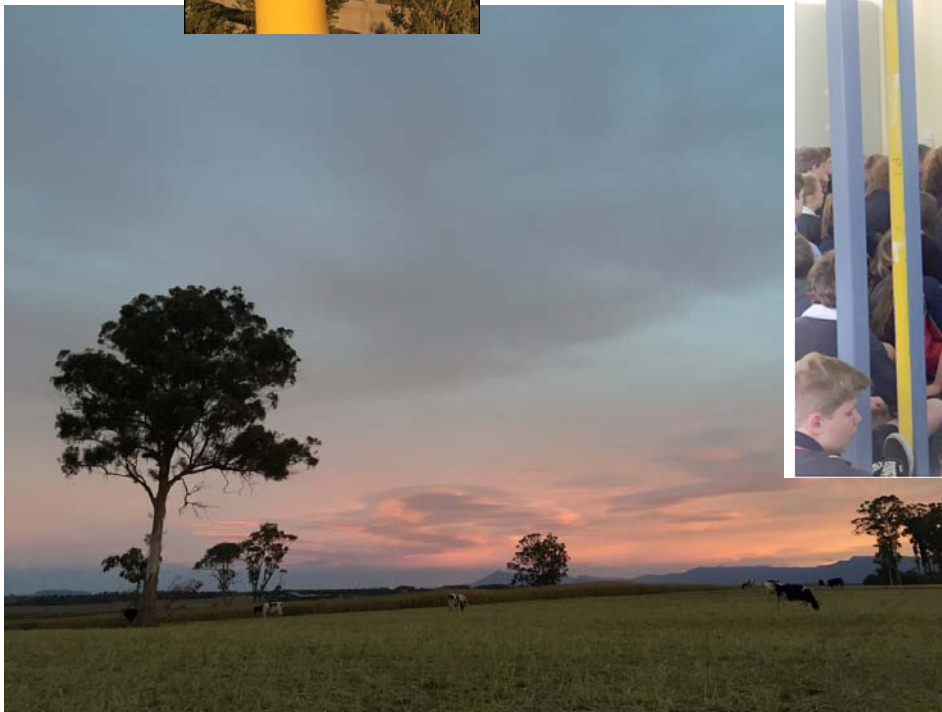

We are also selling Agfest Tickets through our members and our member work and local businesses.

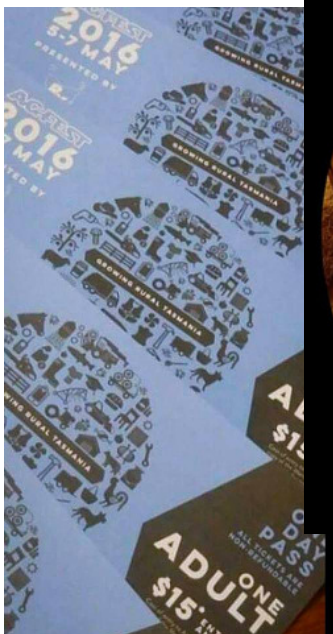
We've had great team work once again, and like they say, 'team work, makes the dream work!'
