For this very reason, we encourage you to spread the word amongst your peers to join the Rural Youth Past Member's Association, to build the network to enable us to include everyone.














Just in case you missed it.....!

The Rural Youth history project is still on sale and available from the Rural Youth office.

A social history of the Rural Youth Organisation of Tasmania Inc., which began as Calf Clubs in the 1930's, then Junior Farmers, until a name change to Rural Youth in the 1950's. This book covers 70 years of the organisation's rich history up until 2013 and includes not only the how and why it all came about, but a treasure trove of memories from members who passed through over many years. It is a very readable and humorous book researched and written by published Historians Nick Haygarth and Tim Jetson. Well worth the purchase price of just \$35.

It also documents the Agfest story, how it began and how it grew into one of Tasmania's finest agricultural events. Agfest is a true success story that has provided the organisation with solid, independent financial grounding which in turn enables ongoing security for the many self-development opportunities benefitting current and future members.
