These have been provided to our members from money provided by Skills Tasmania partnering with Youth Futures.

In January Brady and I travelled to Nubeena to officially open the reformed Tasman Club. Over 25 interested people attended and they are now already organising ute shows and events in their area... The State Ball was an absolute success, over 50 members attended the evening at Tidal Waters in St Helens. The night was full of laughs, singing and later in the night everybody was hitting the dance floor! A highlight of the night was the awards, Callie Barber won the Marcus Oldham Rural Leadership Scholarship, Kingborough-Huon took out Top Club winning \$500, Caitlin Radford was named Rural Youth's Best New Member, and finally Jocelyn Patmore took home Most Outstanding Member for 2019. The commitment from our members to our organisation is unrivalled and I can't express how proud I am to present these awards to such great applicants.

As you would now be aware, a unanimous decision was made by the Agfest Leadership Team, and the Rural Youth Board to cancel the Agfest 2020 event. While this was a significant decision to face, nothing is more important to us than the health and wellbeing of our volunteers, staff, and external stakeholders. Changing gears for a moment, I want to mention the positive:

Many of you would know Jade from his years as a Committee member and volunteer at Agfest. Vicki O'Grady and Ellie Fielding have resigned to take up roles in other industries, Kylie Mackrill is now full time and Luci Scott will be joining us on March 30.

We are now in unchartered waters, prior to the cancellation of Agfest, the Rural Youth Board, Agfest Leadership team and staff were working hard on plans for the future of Agfest and Quercus. These will need to be revised, but regardless of the circumstances all of our efforts will be focused on strengthening our organisation and supporting our members. We are also talking with Government and working on alternatives for our 2020 exhibitors before we come back bigger and better in 2021!

We are far from done and dusted! We will keep you updated as we navigate this new world we find ourselves in!

QUERCUS ACCOMMODATION OPENING

Rural Youth Tasmania were excited to welcome distinguished guests and members past and present to Quercus Park for the official opening of our long-awaited accommodation facility on February 28.

Liberal Senator Claire Chandler represented Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development Michael McCormack and the Australian Government who provided \$96,685 in funding for the \$193,370 project under the Building Better Regions Fund.

Senator Chandler noted that "Rural Youth does a fantastic job supporting the next generation of our vital agriculture sector as well as putting on the sensational Agfest event each year. This new facility allows them to expand their reach and become more sustainable into the future".

The Tasmanian Government were well represented by Mark Shelton and John Tucker, both Members for Lyons and Janet Lambert stood in for Brian Mitchell, Federal Member for Lyons who was unable to attend.

The occasion allowed us to acknowledge all who were involved, particularly our Tasmanian contractors, and showcase the finished product. It was exciting to have Craig Perkins (Regional Development Australia – Tasmania), David Edgar and Adam Sproule (Events Tasmania) present to see the project firsthand and discuss future plans.

The completion of this project marks a major milestone for the Rural Youth Board and organisation at large, we are all extremely proud of the result and look forward to the future. The facility will be available for bookings from June onwards.

Well done to everyone concerned and we look forward to hearing what comes next.



NORTH MOTTON CLUB REPORT


For the past three months the North Motton Rural Youth Club have been busy!




